



Parent Questionnaire Results

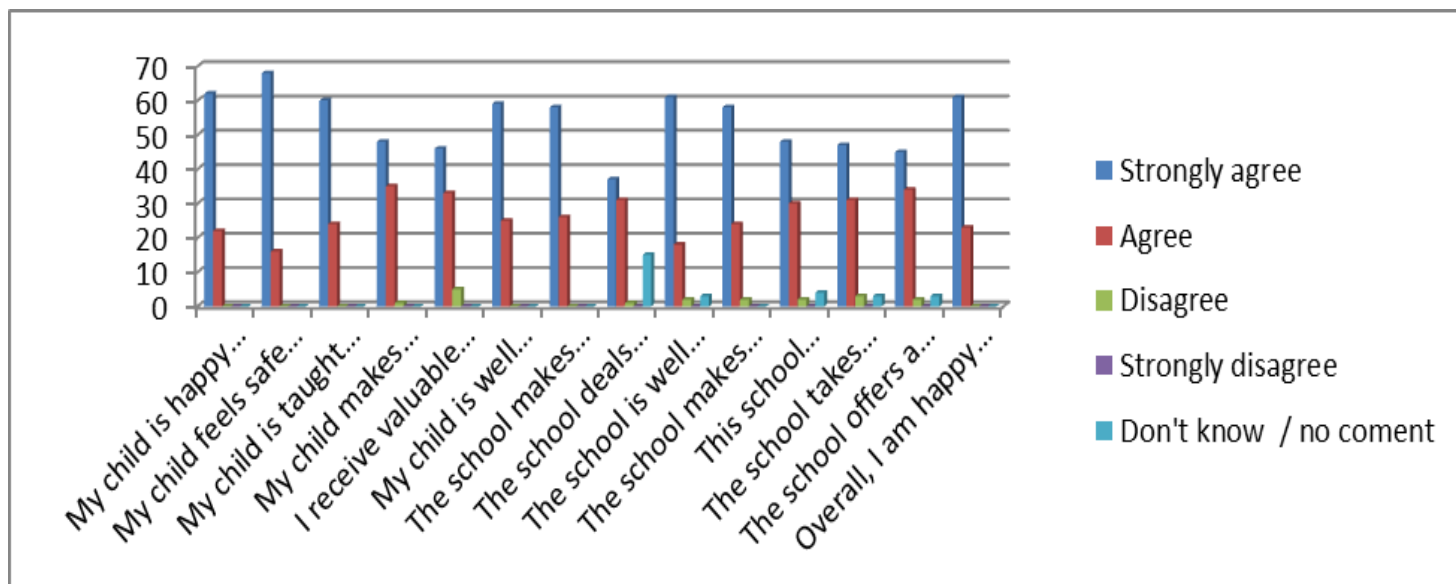
Dear Parents
